

Senior Olympics return to Sheridan July 24-26

The Wyoming Senior Olympics will take place at various locations in Sheridan County on July 24-26.

Last year's Senior Olympics also took place in Sheridan County, with more than 500 participants attending. This year, Wyoming Senior Olympics State Coordinator Jim Eggenberger of Sheridan is expecting more the 700 to compete.

This year's Senior Olympics offers 25 events, anybody 50 or older can enter, and there is no limit to how many events an individual can enter. The gold, silver and

bronze medal winners in each event are automatically eligible to compete in the 2009 National Senior Olympics in Palo Alto, Calif.

This year's events include archery, badminton, basketball, billiards, bowling, canoe racing, cycling, darts, disk golf, golf, horseshoes, mountain biking, pickleball, racquetball, road race, skeet and trap shooting, softball, swimming, table tennis, tennis, track and field, triathlon and volleyball.
